The **UNEA-7 Cities and Regions Summit** is an associated event of the seventh session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-7), recurring since UNEA-4 in 2019. The Summit aims to bring together mayors and other representatives from cities and regions globally to engage in a collaborative dialogue on the pressing issues of climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution. Set against the backdrop of UNEA-7, this Summit provides a unique platform for cities and regions to exchange experiences and strengthen inter-city and multilevel cooperation; and based on those interactions, to relay the voices of the local and regional governments to the Member States participating in UNEA-7.

About UNEA-7

The seventh session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-7) will take place from 8 to 12 December 2025 at the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya, on the theme "Advancing sustainable solutions for a resilient planet". His Excellency Abdullah bin Ali Al Amri, Chair of the Environment Authority of the Sultanate of Oman and UNEA-7 President stated, "Countries must work together towards sustainable solutions for a safer and more resilient planet to support the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Rio+20 outcome document The Future We Want. UNEA-7 will leverage science and effective governance to guide Member States and partners to work towards this end. The theme will inspire Member States to explore and advance solutions such as coherent policies to implement environmental mandates and commitments, improve access and use of scientific data and knowledge sharing, and strengthen collaboration."

This session will set the context and objectives of the Cities and Regions Summit and its agenda. Connecting to the theme of the UNEA-7, it will highlight how cities and regions play a crucial role in implementing sustainable solutions and tackling environmental issues through coordinated and holistic strategies. Environmental Governance: Empowering Local and Regional Governments to Achieve the Goals of the Multilateral Environmental Agreements

The first session will highlight the crucial role of Local and Regional Governments in advancing sustainable solutions for a resilient planet and achieving the goals of the Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs). This session will also highlight how effective multi-level governance mechanisms and adequate frameworks can spur local implementation of integrated solutions that create synergies between climate, biodiversity, and pollution and deliver multiple benefits. The Generation Restoration project in Iloilo City, Philippines, illustrates this synergistic potential: the restoration of a 3-hectare park and a vast mangrove forest is sequestrating over 60 tons of CO2 annually, while restoring the ecosystems and shielding residents from swells and surges with nature-based solutions.

Thematic Session 2 Time: 14:30-16:45 EAT (Nairobi Time) 135 minutes

Overcoming the Financial Barriers: Unlocking Finance for Synergistic Local Action

The second session will highlight the need to align and accelerate finance to implement and scale up synergistic action that contributes to the global environmental goals and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). While environmental and development finance are inherently inadequate and often compromised by other competing economic priorities, the dedicated funding windows for climate, nature, and pollution action, respectively and SDGs create further complexities in aligning these agendas (UNDESA and UNFCCC, 2023). Highlighting a clear economic rationale for integrating these action together, this session will outline starting points, initiatives, and mechanisms to advance this integration at the local and regional government level.

Building on ongoing processes, such as the work of the Local2030 Coalition on Financing, SDSN Global Commission on Urban SDG Finance, Cities Climate Finance Leadership Alliance, and the 4th Financing for Development Conference, it will introduce mechanisms that align finance with NDCs, NBSAPs, and SDGs and create new funding opportunities at the local level. Key recommendations will be outlined for local and regional governments, national governments, financial institutions, the private sector, and other stakeholders in the finance space.
